Louis Hall said they have been spending time on the amendment to the zoning ordinance and the readdressing.

Mrs. Klitsch said there is a bill from Entech, they would like to hold until next month until RUS can look at this.

Mr. Miller said PPL 3 phase power to the Sewer plant. His concern is getting the proper power at the sewer plant. The contract bids are out and he wants to know if we are going to have any problem with the contractor ordering the proper equipment. He doesn't want to see delays.

Kim Mazur said they have been working with PPL They have been given the information over the past few years. He received an email from them about the right-of-way. They said they need to schedule and get a license for the railroad. In the email it says this could take months or years to get. He spoke to them and told them we have this project and we are being funded for this project. He explained we can't have this hold us up. We had a meeting with the PPL supervisors. They feel since we already have an easement from the railroad, the feel we will need flaggers on the railroad and we need to make them aware of this. This project will be split into two phases. The pole and the transformer bank and the anchor installed now. We told them the borough's schedule for the project. They are going to reach out to the railroad. It is just the one railroad on the west side – Reading & Northern Railroad.

Mr. Miller said he is worried about liquidated damages if things are held up. We have verbals from PPL and Reading & Northern, he would like to see something in writing from both organizations.

Borough Manager Sterner asked if we have to have something in our bids award to be contingent upon receiving notification.

Solicitor Nanovic said he understands the concerns and will request this be asked for to cover the borough.

He said they don't need the reservoirs to produce the water. He spoke about the two rescues up at the Glenn Onoko over Labor Day.
