Mayor's Report

Police Chief Schatz informed council that he spoke with Officer Oliver concerning the truck training class. They checked this out and the classes are all filled up this year.

### **Public Comment**

Bill Malatak said at last month's meeting a gentleman asked a question and he was told public comment was over. There are things that are on the agenda that we don't have a clue what they are. He asked council when they go through the agenda if they could give an explanation of what the items are on the agenda.

Bill Malatak asked council if we are living pay check to pay check or do we have money in a rainy day fund?

Mr. Miller said until this year we didn't have anything in any funds. He is concerned with the future and the manager is putting money away into funds for the future. This year 2017 we used balances to balance the budgets and to prevent rises in Water and taxes. We try to keep things down. We are concerned with Sewer because of the 10% increase in sewer rates which will be \$15.00 a month. Some of the trends he is seeing there will be increases. The best thing is to try to keep the expenses to them at a minimum. He looks at this all the time. Right now in the winter months we are living pay check to pay check until we get the taxes, this is usual.

Bill Malatak said the borough received less money in hotel tax money this past year from the County.

Mayor Sofranko said the County looked at the agreement, they are currently giving out less money than in the past because they are receiving less money.

Mr. Miller said in regards to the question about public comments, the borough follows Roberts Rules of order. Public comment is here to ask questions, we have to answer the questions. However, during the course of the meeting the public will intercede on procedural questions and that relies on this body and only this body not the public. After public comment we are here for public order and to get the business for the borough.

President Strubinger said in the past if there was something specifically on the agenda that somebody had a comment on they would ask if they could comments on something on the agenda. Procedural when he asked for questions this was for the board, there may have been a misunderstanding. Council has been lenient. The concerns from the depts. we are responsible for watching the budgets and the spending. We have been doing a good job.

Jerry Strubinger asked council whose terms end this year?

Council members: Curtis Jackson, Joanne Klitsch, Gregory Strubinger and Thomas Highland terms end this year.

Jerry Strubinger said he hopes they all run again, it is hard to get people to run for the positions. He spoke about the JT Area School District taxes. Regional State Police are looking to charge any municipality that don't have a police department \$25.00 per person. We need to have regional police dept. What are we doing with 500 superintendent at \$200,000.00 a piece, we can consolidate everything. There should be one superintendent for one school, we need to have a County school.

Jerry Strubinger said he sees Andy Mueller wants the borough to do a railroad traffic crossing guard for the pedestrian bridge. He should be paying the borough and the school the amusement tax. Someone asked what the lease amount would be for the Memorial hall or is it up for sale.

President Strubinger said we are looking at all options for the hall right now.
